One Love Worldwide's priority is safe access to clean water. We work with communities to implement long-term sustainable solutions to the water crisis.

In 2017, our operation continued to empower people and transform communities through safe access to clean water. Throughout the year, we successfully maintained 29 existing OLW water projects and completed 11 new water rehabilitation projects.

We work in partnership with 34 communities across Ghana's Eastern Region to provide over 50,000 people with safe access to clean water. These joyful faces are some of the people whose lives were positively impacted in 2017, thanks to you. With your continued support, we can and we will change lives for thousands more.

2017 was a remarkable year. We raised record funds and completed a record number of water projects. Notably, the First United Methodist Church of Hobbs, NM, raised almost \$35,000 for a 4x4 vehicle. This will absolutely transform our entire operation, and we are very grateful! We look forward to purchasing a 4x4 in 2018.

The field work in Ghana takes me to unique rural villages of indigenous people, rich culture and history. I build relationships with people and help fulfill one of their greatest needs - safe access to clean water. My photos and stories from the field empower me to create awareness of the water crisis and advocate for those in need. My hometown youth remain my favorite audience, and witnessing their sincere response to help strangers in Ghana is one of my greatest joys. This work is my passion; it continues to touch my soul.

The photo on the bottom left is Georgina and me. After pushing a car up the hill to Agoojah Village to complete our last project of 2016, I met Georgina and witnessed her community walking 30+ minutes round trip to fetch surface water. We desperately tried to repair the borehole, but experts believed the system was damaged beyond repair. We were devastated. In 2017, Agoojah was our first priority. We were able to [get water](#) for Georgina and her village! The bottom right is my new friend, Emmanuel, in the village of Akwadum. This community was also walking 30+ minutes round trip to fetch untreated surface water. Friends, OLW is the real deal. We are out there in remote areas doing whatever it takes to [get water](#) for those who need it most.

We expose the water crisis, and our supporters are inspired to help. OLW supporters believe in our work and invest annually in our success. We complete water projects, prove the positive impact of our work and consistently maintain transparency. This cycle must continue and our life-changing work most certainly will. WATER IS LIFE

YET THERE ARE STILL 844 MILLION PEOPLE WHO DO NOT HAVE CLEAN WATER.¹

Of that 844 million people, 159 million drink untreated water from sources like rivers and streams. Of that 159 million, 59% live in Sub-Saharan Africa where the greatest needs are in rural areas.¹

These rural areas in Sub-Saharan Africa include the very areas where we work in Ghana. In Ghana, almost 6 million people (1 in 5) do not have safe access to clean water. Rather, they rely on surface water, like the water in this photo, to meet their daily needs.² Consequently, 70% of all disease in Ghana is caused by unsafe water and poor sanitation.¹

The good news: we are positively affecting these statistics as we work hard each day to bring an end to the water crisis, one community at a time.

Lack of oversight, maintenance and resources have left tens of thousands of hand pumps inoperable and in need of repair.

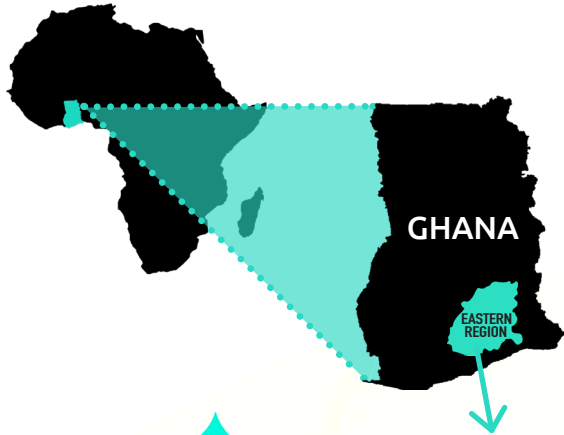
Through our strong water rehabilitation program, we establish a community water team, repair the pump and train the water team to sell their water and efficiently manage their water system.

The community maintains ownership of the borehole and is engaged in every step of the project, from our first visit to our ongoing supervision.

We are sincerely committed to the long-term success and sustainability of every water project completed to date.

We continue to spread our efforts throughout Ghana's Eastern Region, with priority on rural areas, providing safe access to clean water to those who need it most.

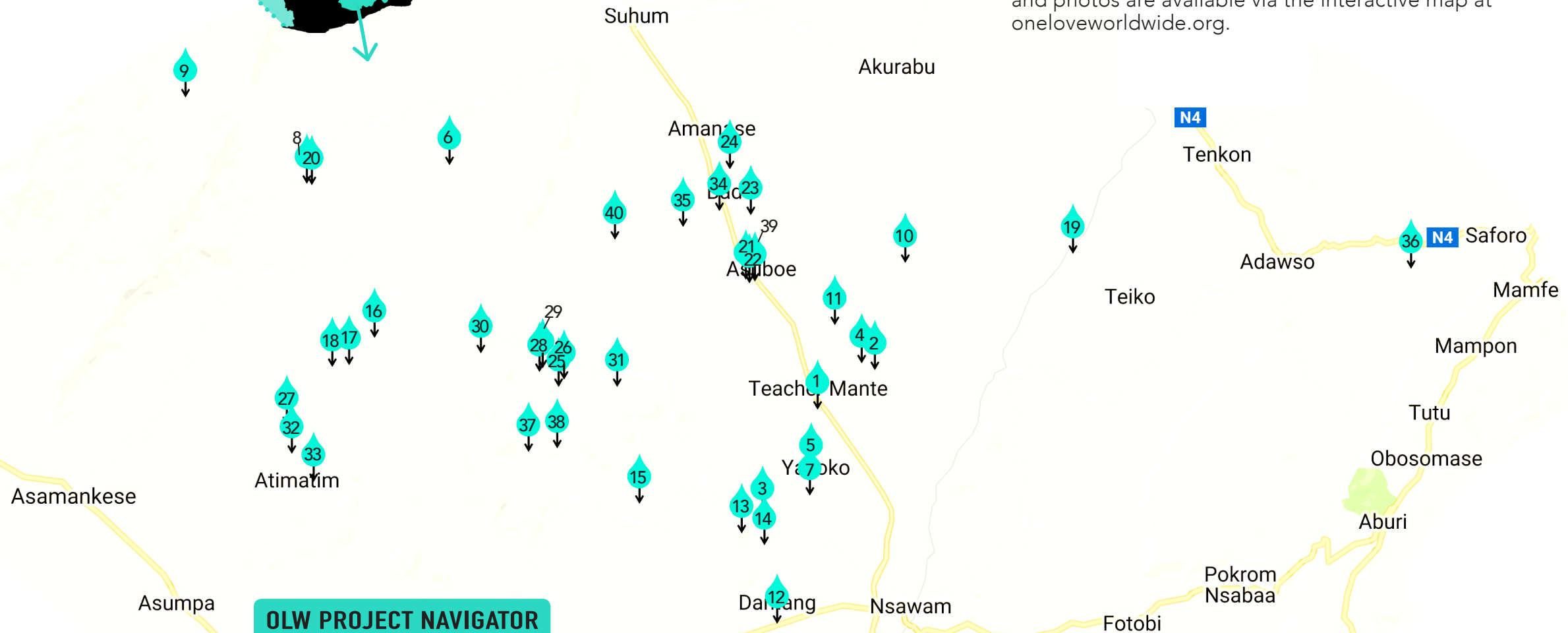
Our positive impact is evident in the long-term success of our water projects; every project since our inception is marked below and pumping clean water today.

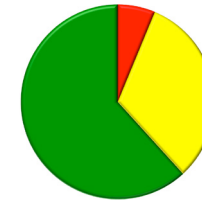

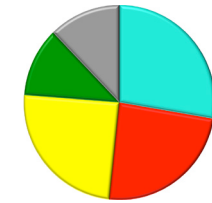

REFLECTING ON OUR INCEPTION

In 2009, our founder, Karli Sue McMurray, spent two months in Ghana, Africa, studying law and interning at the High Court of Accra. During her stay, she made friends with locals and spent time in a rural village where she witnessed unimaginable living conditions. She promised the village she would help. Determined to somehow implement a positive change, she returned to law school and used her photos and stories to advocate on behalf of those she saw suffering. In 2010, she raised \$25,000 and returned to Ghana with her colleague and friend, Katy Jones. Karli honored her promise; a borehole was drilled for the community. One Love Worldwide (OLW) incorporated in 2010 and became an official 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization in 2011. Karli maintains an active license to practice law, but she works full time for OLW and personally oversees every water project. Today, OLW has 40 working water projects providing safe access to clean water for over 50,000 people in Ghana! One love.
