One Love Worldwide is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization working with communities to implement long-term sustainable solutions to the global water crisis. Thanks to you, 2018 was full of accomplishments. We finally purchased our very own 4x4 and shipped it to Ghana. Through our Special Projects, we provided more people with access to education and healthcare than ever. We successfully maintained our 40 existing water projects and completed 14 new water rehabilitation projects providing thousands more with safe access to clean water. To date, we have 54 water projects in 46 villages providing over 60,000 people with safe access to clean water. It is our pleasure to share with you a summary of our 2018.

OLW APPROACH

Lack of oversight, maintenance and resources have left tens of thousands of hand pumps inoperable and in need of repair. One Love Worldwide created a solution.

Through our water rehabilitation program, we establish a community water team, repair the pump and prepare the team to sell their water and efficiently manage their water system.

Community involvement is key to the long-term success of the project, so our work begins long before we open our tool box. First, we meet with the elders and explain our expectations. The community has ownership of the borehole and is engaged in every step of the project.

We build partnerships with each community and together we create long-term sustainable solutions. This ambitious goal requires a long-term commitment on our part. We are invested in the people and their communities. Our passion leads us and our approach works.
