a word from our founder

2022 was uplifting for One Love Worldwide. Our loyal supporters combined with new donors to boost our whole operation. Cowboy Junction Church's Create Women's Conference raised \$33,000 for clean water. The annual event was a special and spiritual experience. We are grateful, as are the many Ghanaians with new access to clean water.

We were finally reunited with our 4x4 and spent several months trekking wild roads to rural areas across Ghana's Eastern Region. We formed new partnerships with communities and completed 13 water projects.

Throughout 2022 and 2023, we made needed improvements at our headquarters. We also continued One Love Special Projects.

In 2023 we prioritized maintenance, spending many months covering thousands of miles to visit communities and maintain 91 existing projects. With much work to be completed, I spent a record 10 months in Ghana. Visiting old water projects is one of my favorite jobs; seeing clean water flow from old projects is so rewarding. I also love reuniting with familiar faces and noticing the community's improvements.

During our maintenance work, we discovered new communities and new needs. From those discoveries, we completed one water rehabilitation. We also successfully drilled a new borehole for the small village of Kokosiase thereby providing them with their first safe source of clean water.

Thank you for making both 2022 and 2023 a success. **93 water projects across 74 communities serving over 85,500 people with safe access to clean water – that, my friends, is very special.** Cheers to the generous; may the Most High continue to bless you for caring for those who have too little.

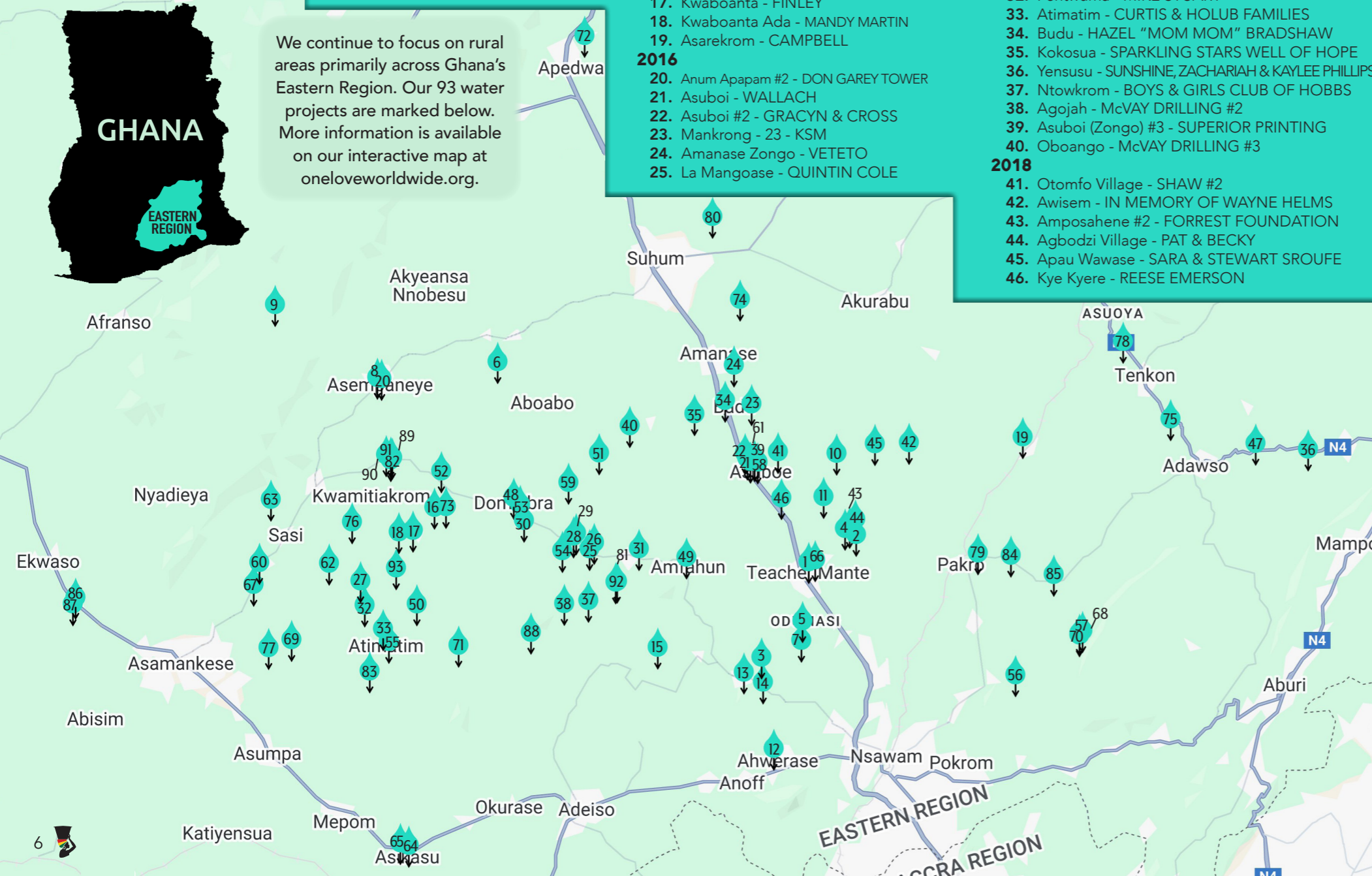

OUR APPROACH

We drill new water wells and install new handpumps, as well as rehabilitate abandoned and inoperable projects. With both approaches, we implement long-term sustainable water solutions that are **locally lead**. Before we even begin water work, we spend much time on our inquiries assuring the community is prepared and committed to work together to improve their environment.

Through our water rehabilitation program, we join forces with communities to create a water team, repair their pump and prepare the team to sell the water and efficiently manage their water system. The community maintains ownership of the borehole and is engaged in every step of the project.

We are excited to share with you our 2022 and 2023 water projects.

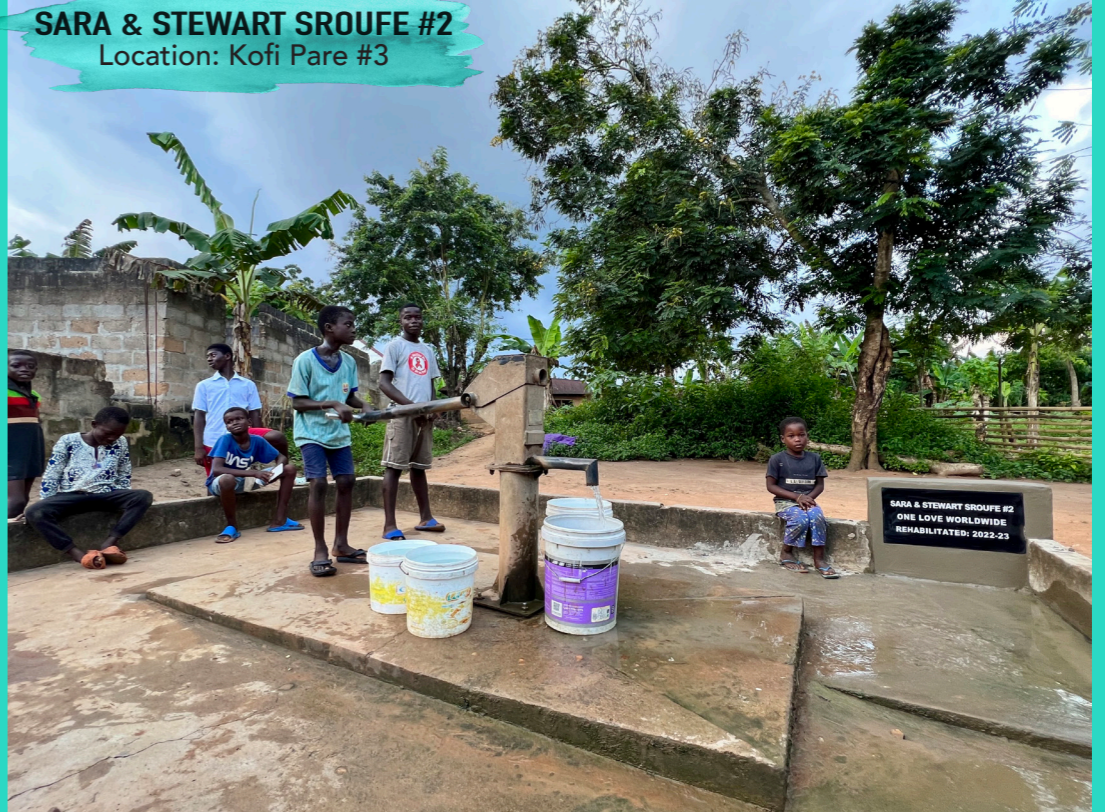


As we often do, we worked late into the night with the community's help. Securing a safe water source is always exciting; it was a celebration this night as we persevered through the rain.



We found the inoperable hand pump located next to the school. Nearby, the children were using a type of wheel-operated pulley system affixed atop a hand-dug well. The boy spun the wheel continuously for just a small amount of water. Our crew got the hand pump back in working order.

The community of Bepoase's primary source of water was this hand-dug well on the left that was pulling dirty water from the reservoir below. Bepoase was in dire need of repairs to their inoperable pump (p.13) that we found hidden in the bush. The steep washed out roads made reaching this location very difficult, and with no cell phone service, we struggled to even communicate with the elders. However, after multiple visits, clean water is flowing!

The community of Kokosiase depended on an often dry hand-dug well. The chief lead us through rough terrain to a reservoir of surface water where they fetch when the hand-dug well is dry.

After meeting with the community, we brought in surveyors to determine whether drilling a borehole was an option. Over many weeks we worked with surveyors and drillers.

ONE LOVE SPECIAL PROJECTS

For more than a decade, One Love Special Projects has allowed us to provide people with support separate from access to clean water. Our assistance varies and may include access to healthcare and education, accommodations and more. Over the years we have built special bonds with those we help. We will forever cherish these relationships. Here are just a few of the youth we have helped.



Drilling was successful! We then performed a pumping test to determine the water volume in the hole. We also had the water tested for quality. Lastly, we constructed a cement platform and installed the pump.




FINANCIALS


